- Located just 2-1/2 blocks from Carilion Children's Hospital
- Serves as a home-away-from-home for families and includes 18 bedrooms, each with a private bath and 2 queen-size beds
- The House also has 2 large dining rooms, laundry facilities, a playroom, library, an outdoor playground, and new this year- a Magic Room

RONALD MCDONALD FAMILY ROOM®

- Located on the 14th floor of Carilion Children's Hospital, just outside the NICU
- Serves an average of 7,500 visitors each year since it opened in 2007
- Provides a respite area for adults of pediatric patients- offering light snacks, microwavable meals, and beverages along with computer access

To the communities of Central & Southwest Virginia,

Your investment in the Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southwest Virginia helped provide 3,468 family nights in 2018. Take a moment to truly understand the depth and breadth of that number. You and your fellow supporters of the House have helped provide a home-away-from-home for families who had to travel a significant distance to receive medical care in Roanoke, Virginia. Those families didn't have to worry about how they were going to pay for a hotel for weeks at a time or even months on end. MEET GUNNER...

In order to understand all of Gunner's diagnoses, you would need a medical dictionary: hypotonia, dysphagia, cardiomyopathy, atrial septal defect, craniostenosis, tethered spinal cord, hypospadias, scoliosis, bilateral hip dysplasia, clubfoot, GERD, and chronic lung disease.

He has been G-tube dependent his whole life and at 5 months old, he received a tracheotomy- at times requiring a ventilator.

BLESSED

Born March 17, 2017, at 33 weeks, Gunner has spent 26 weeks of his life inpatient. When people ask his mom, Amber, how she does it, she says, "as long as Gunner is okay, I am okay." Understandably, she says there are days she feels depressed but when she sees how happy Gunner is to be here after everything he has been through Amber says, "I realize how truly lucky I am."

When most moms of toddlers are dealing with the trials of terrible twos, Amber spends her days administering breathing treatments, physical therapy, and speech therapy. She describes it as part of everyday life, "like brushing your teeth and combing your hair every day, you get used to it."







SCARY TIMES —

Amber admits there have been multiple times they did not know if Gunner would make it. But one of the scariest times was when he coded.

As an EMS responder herself,
Amber says, "never in my wildest
dreams did I imagine that I would
code my own son. He was gone, no
heartbeat, no nothing, and by the
grace of God I was able to get him
back right before paramedics got to
the house." She says after being flown
to Roanoke, it was touch and go for a
long time. "That will always be the
absolute worst day of my life."

STAYING AT THE RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

"I do know this- without the Ronald McDonald House, there is no way that I would have ever been able to make it. We live 112 miles from Roanoke Memorial and there is no way I could have afforded to drive up there and back every day and afford meals every day. The Ronald McDonald House always gave me a warm bed to sleep in, a hot shower, roof over my head, hot meals every day. I could wash my clothes and anything that I needed they always had. The Ronald McDonald House has given Gunner birthday presents and Christmas presents to Easter baskets to Halloween baskets. You have made us all a part of your family and I cannot thank you enough for everything you all have done for us. God has truly blessed us".



LOVE & FAMILY

Over the past couple of years, we've gotten to know this family well here at the Ronald McDonald House. Not only have we seen them endure the trials of a critically-ill child, they've encountered their own personal trials along the way like Amber's eye surgery, and Gunner's grandfather's traumatic car accident. Through it all, they have exuded what Ronald McDonald House Charities is all about... Love and Family.


